### KEY MESSAGES YOU CAN USE TO TALK ABOUT OUR ISSUE

- Last year, the United States Chamber of Commerce ranked the legal liability climate in Kentucky as 42<sup>nd</sup> in the nation, down from 37<sup>th</sup> in 2015. Other states, including our neighbors, are taking steps to improve their climate as Kentucky continues to fall behind.
- **SB2 *only*** asks voters to approve an amendment giving their elected representatives in the General Assembly the authority to establish thresholds on legal damages. These can be adjusted as necessary to ensure fair compensation for victims and predictability for business.
- Almost every state in our region has adopted commonsense thresholds for jury-awarded damages. Kentucky must level the playing field to compete for investment and to attract the health care options we deserve.
